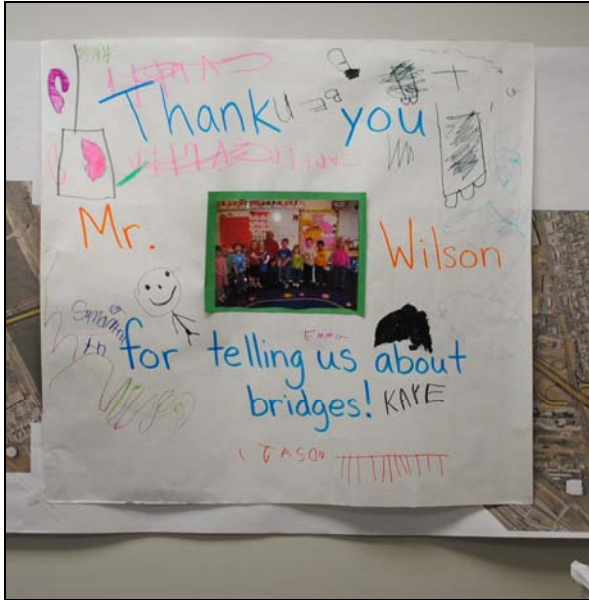


Can You Spell B-R-I-D-G-E?
